Jamal Powell Legacy Grant

Our flagship grant program honors
Coach Jamal Powell, who passed away
in 2021 at age 39 after a hard-fought
battle with cancer. He is survived by his
wife and their three young children.
Coach Powell continues to be the
heartbeat behind everything we do.
Our Jamal Powell Legacy Grants allow
us to walk alongside coaching families
in need and serve them in thoughtful,
meaningful ways. We are proud to
share that because of your support, we
were able to award this grant to four
families navigating unimaginable
hardships in FY23.



New initiatives



In response to the growing concern over cardiac events in sports, we recently launched the **AED Initiative**, which provides secure, publicly accessible Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to parks and sports facilities in rural and underserved communities. We are currently finalizing a pilot program to provide four AEDs in Culpeper County, VA, ensuring that coaches, officials, athletes and spectators have lifesaving resources readily available during emergencies.



Recognizing the pivotal role coaches play in shaping the lives of young athletes, BMF champions April as **Coaches Health & Wellness Month**. This comprehensive campaign focuses on coaches' mental, physical and emotional well-being, offering resources such as nutrition counseling, stress management workshops, and fitness best practices. We believe that by investing in coaches' health, we strengthen their ability to inspire and support the athletes under their guidance. We would be remiss if we did not recognize our interns for their passion and high-quality work that made this initiative an overwhelming success for us this year.



Inspired by Coach Powell's trademark optimism during his cancer treatments, **The Best Day of My Life** is our health check day for collegiate coaches and their staffs. A collaboration between BMF and university health resources, the program brings doctors to coaches' offices to provide convenient and comprehensive point-of-care health screenings. BMF is planning on piloting the program this year with the football staffs at James Madison University, Southern Methodist University, and Texas Christian University.

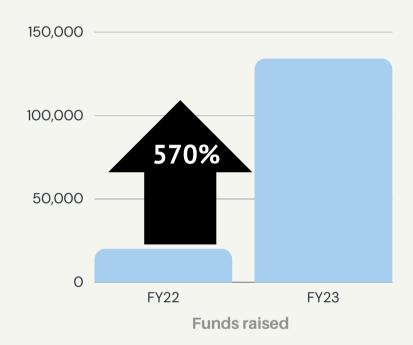
73% of funds raised in FY23 went directly to our programs
